Dry Cat Food Transition Guidelines

The Nature's Logic Dry Cat Food flavors of chicken, duck & salmon, and rabbit are formulated in a way that no other cat or dog food has been formulated. Cats find the dry foods extremely palatable and take to them readily. Due to these diets being a totally new type of health food, some cats will eagerly swallow the food quickly and whole during the first offering. Because of this, a transitional protocol should be considered in order to avoid digestive upset from gulping. Once your cat is transitioned on any of the Nature's Logic foods, you will be very pleased with the change you see in your pets.

Most dry cat foods are formulated with a meat or poultry source and one or more grain products. If a particular formulation is lacking in enough protein due to low percentages of meat or poultry inclusion, companies will add ingredients such as gluten or soybean to raise the crude protein level for adequacy. Also, some companies will add small amounts of fruits or vegetables, but the inclusion rate is mainly for label dressing and is not included at a functional level. This type of formulation must be fortified with as many as 26 chemically synthesized vitamins, minerals, and synthetic taurine in order to meet adequacy requirements. It is now known in the light of the recent recalls that most of the added vitamins and taurine incorporated into pet foods also come from China.

Nature's Logic formulations require no added chemically synthesized vitamins, minerals, or amino acids such as taurine. Its formulas are made from 100% whole foods at inclusion rates that guarantee efficacy. There has never been a diet created that uses an equal amount of high meat or poultry and organ meat, concentrate of fruits and vegetables, gluten free millet, probiotics and enzymes to what is formulated into Nature's Logic. This concentrate is extremely nutritious, high in natural whole food vitamins, minerals, and needs to be introduced with care and caution in order for your cat to be successfully transitioned without any digestive upset.

Therefore, Nature's Logic is not like any food that has ever been offered to your pet, and the following suggestions are offered for transitioning.

- Be prepared to transition slowly over as much as a two week period. Don't be in a hurry.
- During the first few days continue to feed your present food, less a small portion. In addition to your cat's regular meals, offer by hand or in a separate bowl no more than a couple teaspoons of dry Nature's Logic. Do this for at least 3 days in a row.
- After the 3rd day offer in a bowl, with no other food around, a tablespoon of the new Nature's Logic food. Allow up to 30 minutes to make sure there are no problems before offering its regular bowl of its old diet less the tablespoon.
- Feed the above amount for the next 3 days and then gradually increase Nature's Logic daily until you are feeding an entire day's amount. At this stage, you can mix the two diets together, gradually decreasing the old diet and increasing the Nature's Logic.
- Never free feed your cat – always portion feed to control weight and increase appetite.
- From the very beginning, when you start feeding the tablespoon amount, if your cat gulps or eats the food too quickly, try putting into the bowl a couple objects to make the cat eat slower. Something like smooth medium size rocks will suffice. This is an old trick of cat breeders often used on gulpers.
- A number of users of the Nature's Logic have had easy transition to the dry food by first using the Nature's Logic canned foods. The water content in the canned food helps with digestion and assimilation of the super concentrate of ingredients in the same way water is recommended to be taken with certain human concentrate food supplements. Also, adding water to the dry food might be helpful if your cat will eat the kibble moistened.
